


How to look after your dentures




Guidance

New dentures can feel a little strange at first.



This should improve after a few days.




If your mouth becomes sore, make an appointment to see the dentist




Remember to wear your denture for a few hours before your appointment, so that the dentist can see where it hurts



If you have partial dentures, always take them out when you brush your own teeth



Always clean your dentures over a bowl or sink full of water.



If you drop your denture the water will stop it from breaking.



Brush your dentures twice a day with ordinary toothpaste.



The denture can be put in denture cleaner but always follow the manufacturer's instructions.



Never leave your denture in denture cleaner overnight.



Never use bleach to clean your denture.



This might damage your denture.



Always leave your dentures in a container of cold water overnight.



Do not forget to change the water every day.



If you are having new dentures made ask the dentist to put your name on them.



This is especially important if you have to stay in hospital as dentures can sometimes get lost.



Make sure you visit the dentist at least once a year to have your mouth checked.
